- n = Die Anzahl der Nennungen zu dieser Frage.
- mw = Mittelwert; hier das arithmetische Mittel.
- md = Median; Der Median halbiert die Verteilung der Nennungen. unter- und oberhalb dieses Wertes liegt jeweils die Hälfte der Datenwerte.
- s = Standardabweichung; ein Streuungsmaß, das angibt, wie weit die einzelnen Werte im Durchschnitt vom Mittelwert entfernt liegen.
- E = Anzahl der Enthaltungen zu dieser Frage.

Im Abschnitt "Globalwerte" des Berichts sind für die folgenden Themenbereiche der Mittelwert (mw) und die Standardabweichung (s) abgebildet:

- 1) "Planning and Presentation": Erfasst wie gut die Veranstaltung geplant und gegliedert ist und wie gut die Inhalte vermittelt werden.
- 2) "Interaction with Students": Erfasst in welchem Ausmaß sich die/der Lehrende freundlich und respektvoll gegenüber den Studierenden verhält, an ihrem Lernerfolg Interesse zeigt und auf sie eingeht.
- 3) "Interestingness and Relevance": Erfasst wie interessant die Veranstaltung gestaltet ist und in welchem Umfang die Verwendbarkeit und der Nutzen des Stoffes verdeutlicht wird.
- 4) "Quality of Presentations": Erfasst die Vorbereitung der ReferentInnen sowie die Qualität der Referate und Vorträge.
- 5) "Difficulty, Pace and Complexity": Erfasst inwieweit der Stoffumfang, der Schwierigkeitsgrad und das Tempo angemessen sind.

Sollte die Anzahl der ausgewerteten Fragebögen (N) unter 16 liegen, wurden die offenen Antworten manuell anonymisiert.

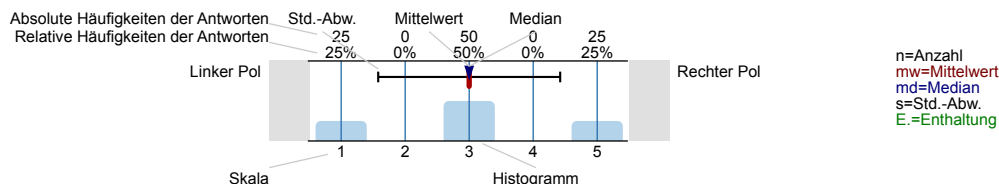
Difficulty, Pace and Complexity (Optimum = 3)

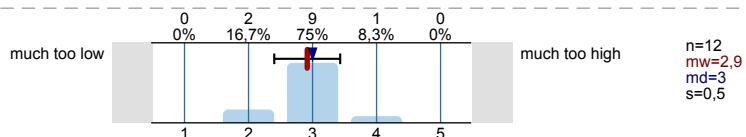
